Purpose of the position

To ensure compliance with the Infection Prevention & Control Standards in Health and Disability Services Standard Ngā Paerewa NZS 8134:2021.

With the support of an IPC Nurse Specialist Consultant as a resource, you will provide specialist evidence-based advice, care, support and expertise. As the Lead IPC Link Associate, you'll be responsible for leading and managing the IPC Link Associates Group.

Position Responsibilities

 Act as a role model to staff in their workplace by upholding and advocating the correct standard of infection prevention practices i.e. Standard Precautions, Hand Hygiene, Asepsis.

- Be a proactive resource person when there are specific infection prevention and control needs e.g. patient with an MDRO.
- Manage the surveillance of surgical site infections programme and associated reporting.
- Participate in the implementation of action plans related to the surveillance outcomes.
- Collect the appropriate data required to demonstrate antimicrobial stewardship activity within the hospital services.
- Collaborate with the IPC Nurse Specialist Consultant and hospital Clinical Pharmacist to source and collate data on volume usage of antimicrobials and prescribing patterns.
- Provide a report quarterly to the Infection Prevention and Control Committee.
- Identify and report Infection Prevention and Control issues.
- Oversee hand hygiene auditing, documentation and reporting.
- Assist with new product evaluation and selection.
- Involved with reviewing, developing, assessing and education of IPC core documentation including policies and procedures linked to IPC.
- Identify training needs and provide supplementary education in addition to that provided by the IPC Nursing Specialist Consultant.
- Maintain and further own education on Infection Prevention and Control best practice.
- Attend and complete hand hygiene gold auditor training.
- Network with other Infection Prevention and Control Professionals by becoming aware of IPC national network through HNZ, NZNO IPC College and NZPSHA.
- Lead the other IPC link associates ensuring cleaning audits are completed, teaches auditing
 processes, is a resource to the link associates and the wider Kaweka team.
- Train other link associates and auditing hand hygiene competence.
- Facilitate and attend IPC committee meetings including agenda preparation, meeting chairing and providing link associate team report and surveillance updates, reports and meeting minutes.
- Raises any IPC concerns to the IPC Nurse Specialist Consultant, Nurse Manager and/or IPC and AMS committee as required, including any concerns raised at the link associate meetings.
- Directs clinicians to report any infections for further investigation.
- Organises national and international IPC awareness events i.e. Hand Hygiene Week and IPC Week.
- Provides an IPC update at staff meetings i.e. the theatre team meeting.
- Manages allocated IPC time to complete listed responsibilities and regularly updates Nurse Manager.

- Supports a health workforce that reflects the Hawke's Bay community.
- Demonstrates knowledge and understanding of local tikanga and Māori culture and supports the use of Te Reo Māori.
